DSW retreats range from one-day experiences to week-long immersions, and summer internships, which allow college students to participate even more deeply in the mission. Every retreat includes prayer, reflection, and discussion rooted in Salesian Spirituality and Catholic Social Teaching, helping participants connect service with faith and to understand their call as instruments of God's love in the world.

This ministry supports communities burdened by the struggles so common in inner-city America, as it forms the next generation of faithful servant leaders. Young people leave DSW with renewed hearts, broader perspectives, and a stronger commitment to living the Gospel through service.
