# 2024-05-10 Council Meeting – 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Report Mark Nienhuis

As you heard in the exemplification, the first three degrees of our order are: Charity, Unity, and Fraternity.

The Assembly represents the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree, Patriotism.

For informational purposes, Assembly 1828 is comprised of five (5) councils:

- Bishop Hafey Council 4507 High Point, NC (this Council)
- Our Lady of the Highway Council 9249 Thomasville, NC
- St. Joseph's of Asheboro Council 10891 Asheboro, NC
- St. Francis de Sales Council 12481 Lexington, NC
- Christ The King Council 14767 High Point, NC

### Exemplification

We have a separate exemplification for the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree.

- The new format, similar to the Council's, is shorter. Time is approximately 1 hour.
- Cost has increased to \$90 per candidate.
- No tuxedos. Social Baldrics are also out.
- Candidates can buy the new regalia or wear a "dark" colored suit.

### Regalia

- Assembly 1826 is providing a second round of subsidies, \$200, towards the purchase of the new regalia. We still have five (5) subsidies available. This is approximately 40% of the cost.
- We have three (3) ceremonial swords and service baldrics still available. These were donated by former Knights and/or their families.
