Minutes for the September meeting were approved without revision, motion by R.V. Wakefield, seconded by John Mullin.

Chaplain's Message:

Substitute Chaplain Deacon Francis Skinner announced his appointment to be the Deacon at Pennyburn. However he will continue to be a member of IHM, this Council and Assembly.

Grand Knight's Report: (Mark Nienhuis)

- GK Mark introduced representatives from the Tiny house for the veterans organization and
 made an appeal for financial support for upcoming tiny house project in High Point and also
 for a styrofoam recycling trailer at IHM. More details regarding their request will be
 forthcoming regarding the fundraising kickoff at Masses near Veteran's Day to
 request support for raising \$20k for a tiny house and \$2400 for a recycling trailer.
- Steve Ilderton presented the request for the Knight's to fund the purchase the new Nativity set for inside the Church. RV Wakefield made a motion and seconded by Paul Zito that the Council fund the \$7k for the purchase of the new indoor Nativity set with a stipulation that a visible recognition that the set is being provided by Bishop Hafey Council #4507 permanently. Motion was tabled and will be voted upon at the Nov. meeting.
- Our fraternal benefits agent, Miquel Flores, will make a presentation during the social time at our November meeting. This will satisfied one of the two fraternal events required of Star Council recognition.
- The "Baiju Bash"/New Years' Eve 25th anniversary of being a priest will replace our Christmas party this year. The Council has been requested to provide beer and wine for the event. Rick Boedicker made a motion to spend up to \$1000 to purchase beer and wine for the event which would be served by the Knights. Steve Ilderton seconded. This motion was tabled to be voted on at the November meeting because the amount exceeded \$500.
- Coats for Kids. Our order has been received and is in the process of being distributed.
- Additional items highlighted as requirements for Star Council are indicated in the attachment. One critical activity now is the State Raffle for which the Raffle tickets have been received and ready for distribution A chairman for that project is needed immediately.
- Another upcoming event in the near future is Breakfast with St Nick for which a chairman is also needed, essentially to cook and serve pancakes.
- Fruit sale in underway and Sign Up Genius has openings for volunteers to be available to take orders after the Masses the weekends of Nov. 2nd and 9th.

Bishop Hafey Council 4507 Meeting Protocol

How to Make a Motion (Based upon: Knights of Columbus – The Guidelines for Council Meetings – Page 15)

- 1. The following procedure is generally recognized as good form in making a motion. A member obtains the floor through the following steps:
 - Stands.
 - Addresses the Grand Knight as "Worthy Grand Knight",
 - States their name,
 - And renders the salute.

 (Representing the tree of the Cross, the member makes a vertical motion, with his arm and vertically open hand, from top to bottom).
- 2. Grand Knight recognizes the speaker:
 - By announcing his name,
 - And rendering the salute in return.
 (Representing the arms of the Cross, the Faithful Navigator makes a horizontal motion, with his arm and horizontally open hand, from left to right).
 - The speaker may not present the motion until recognized by the Grand Knight.
- 3. Member states the motion carefully. This is usually done by saying "I move that _____" or "I move the adoption of the following resolution." It is best to have the motion prepared in written form before the meeting.
- 4. If the motion requires a second, it must be seconded before it can be discussed. If it does not receive a second, it is lost. Any eligible member, other than the one who made the motion, may second it. To second, members must follow the aforementioned procedure (Step 1) to obtain the floor and (Step 2) to be recognized.
- 5. Grand Knight repeats the motion in full. Typically, this statement is along the lines of the following: "The motion has been made and seconded that______. Is there any discussion?"
- 6. The motion is then open for discussion. To participate, members must follow the aforementioned procedure (Step 1) to obtain the floor and (Step 2) to be recognized.
- 7. The Grand Knight encourages as much discussion as possible. In this way, the facts and merits of the question are brought to light and members can vote more intelligently.

The person who makes the motion is usually given the opportunity to open and close the discussion.

8. After a motion and a second to move the previous question, the vote is taken.
